Pupil of the Week



In order to publicly recognise students who show a positive attitude to learning, display the school values and have made considerable effort to improve an aspect of school life, Sunbury Heights has a Pupil of the Week award that is given to a child in each class on a weekly basis. Specialist staff also presents an award to the "Class of the Week.

The Pupil of the Week awards are given out at Monday afternoon's assembly. The list of recipients will be in the newsletter of the week before. At next Monday's assembly the students listed in today's newsletter will receive their ribbon and certificate.

Class Captains Award Ceremony

At next Monday's assembly class captains will be formally presented to the school community. The class captain role is something that students in grades 3-6 can aspire to. The class captains are expected to display the values of the school. The process for selection is each child who wishes to be considered needs to write a speech about how they will represent the class and how they will help their fellow students. After this the class vote on who they feel would best represent them. These names will be announced at Monday's assembly.

Visitor's Pass

If you are staying in the school for period of time, we ask that you call into the office to sign in and collect a 'Visitor's Badge' to wear while in the school.

This ensures we know who is in the school at any one time as well as ensuring the safety of our students and should it be necessary to put an Emergency Management Plan into effect we then know who is in the school and can ensure everyone's safety.

Office Hours

This year the Office will be open from 8am until 4.30pm Monday to Friday. Our friendly office staff will be able to answer your queries and record information in regard to student absence and any other messages you may wish to leave regarding your child's medication or contact needed with the classroom teacher.

School Crossing

Our school is serviced by two school crossings. It is important that students use the supervised crossings, even when crossing the road with an adult. This helps children to develop safe habits and keeps everyone safe. Please ensure that as a driver you wait until the Crossing Supervisor is off the crossing and stay behind the line designated will waiting.



Please obey speed limits in designated school speed zones during specified times (8.00am - 9.30am and 2.30pm - 4.00 pm). The speed limit during this time is 40km.

Parent Concerns

As a parent, you may not always be aware of whom to approach if you have any concerns regarding school issues. These are the guidelines you need to follow if a concern may arise.

Addressing Parent Concerns

Sunbury Heights Primary School is committed to treating everyone with dignity and respect and encourages good communication between our parents and the school.

Teaching and learning works best when parents and teachers talk to each other and work together to solve problems.

Parents' concerns and complaints most commonly relate to:

- The management of an incident between students at school
- The education or progress of their child
- · The development and implementation of school; and general education policy

We need to know if you have any concerns about your child's education.

How do I raise an issue or make a complaint?

The school should always be the first point of contact.

How do I frame my concern?

- When contacting the school plan, what you will say, so you can clearly explain what the problem is
- Have some ideas about how the problem can be solved
- Talk about the problem with the child's teacher by telephone or appointment. Most problems can be solved this way.

Who do I talk to?

- Your child's teacher about learning issues and incidents that happen in the classroom or in the yard
- Cathie Morcom, Assistant Principal about issues relating to staff members or complex student issues
- Kaye Mills, Principal specifically about issues relating to school policy, school management, staff members or complex student issues.

Any appointments to speak with school staff should be arranged through the office.

You cannot speak sternly, make threats or discipline a child from another family. If you believe a child is misbehaving, then please notify the classroom or yard duty teacher immediately. It is the responsibility of the Principal and teaching staff to carry out any necessary disciplinary action in accordance with school and Department policies.
