Child Safe Standards

At next month's meeting school council will help draft a statement that affirms Sunbury Heights' commitment to child safety by clearly stating that we will:

- · have zero tolerance for child abuse
- actively works to listen to and empower children
- have systems to protect children from abuse
- we will take all allegations and concerns very seriously and responds to them consistently in line with the organisation's policies and procedures
- · be committed to promoting cultural safety for Aboriginal children for children from culturally and/or linguistically diverse backgrounds
- provide a safe environment for children with a disability.

Parent Payments

Helping non-sporty kids stay physically active

The Australian Department of Health recommends that children aged between 5 and 12 be active for <u>at least</u> 60 minutes a day, with the 60 minutes including both moderate and vigorous activity. Children who run vigorously during their lunch break or participate in after school sports may easily achieve this daily target. It may however be more difficult for children who dislike team sports, find physical activity challenging or prefer to spend their time in a quieter manner.

There are a variety of reasons why children do not want to participate in sport or physical activity such as feeling shy or embarrassed, feeling incompetent, disinterest, a dislike for the uniform, temperature concerns (too hot or cold) or feeling pressured to perform/ win. Having an open and honest conversation may be beneficial to identify a child's concerns and to help address them. It is important to communicate to children the importance physical activity for their overall health and wellbeing so they can be responsible for their own choices.



Some children may need additional encouragement and support to achieve the recommended 60 minutes of physical activity each day. Assisting them to develop a love for non-competitive physical activities may be the answer. There are many exciting, non-competitive activities that can improve a child's health and wellbeing and may develop into lifelong hobbies. Some examples of activities that can be non-competitive are; yoga, surfing, skateboarding, rock climbing, bike riding, bush walking, dancing, kayaking, frisbee or walking the dog.

Parents and carers can have a strong impact by personally engaging in exercise and presenting a positive attitude towards it, and children will be more likely to want to participate in physical activity themselves. Fun, physical outings are also a way to strengthen your relationship within your family while modelling a value of health and wellbeing


