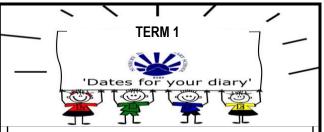

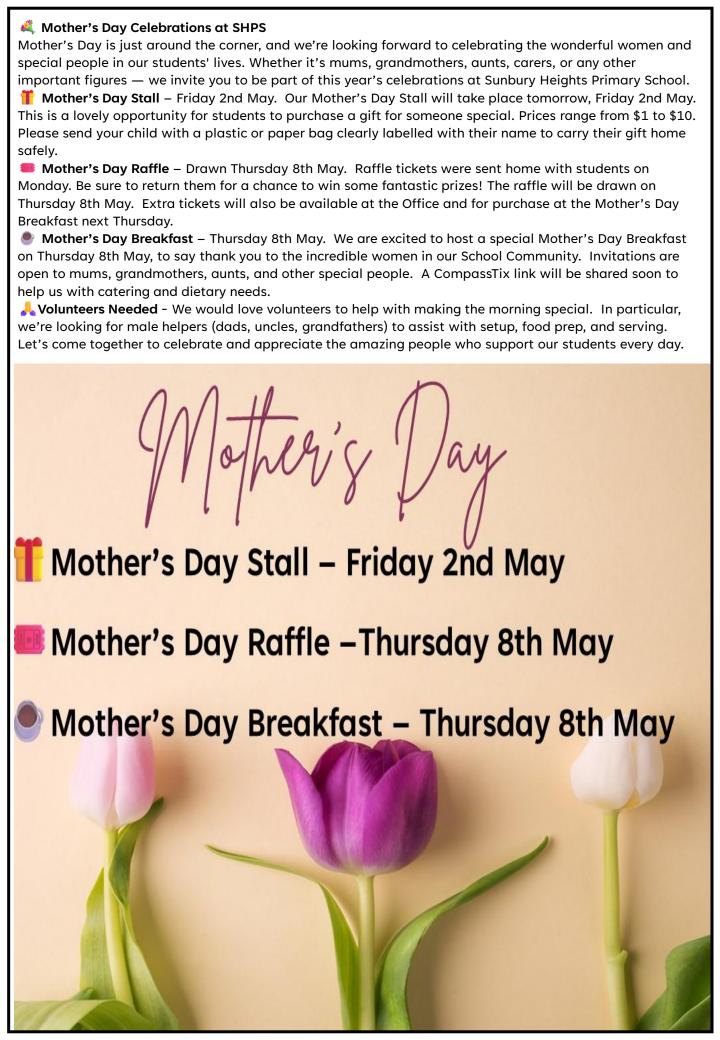

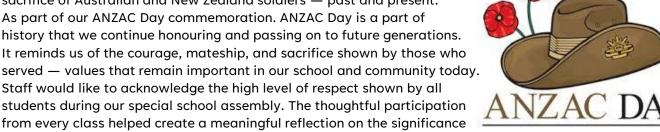




ANZAC DAY SERVICE

At Sunbury Heights Primary School, we're marking the week with a range of activities that highlight diversity and encourage students to share their own stories and backgrounds.

Tuesday 20th May – Open Classroom (2:25pm – 3:15pm) Families are invited to visit their child's classroom for a special cultural activity. Students will mark their family's place of origin on a world map and create a flag that represents their culture or heritage. It's a great chance for parents and carers to see what students are learning and be part of the celebration.

eSafety: How to Role Model Safe Online Habits for Your Child

Being online is a big part of young people's lives — for learning, connecting with friends, and having fun. That's why it's so important that children learn how to stay safe and make smart choices online. One of the best ways to support this is by role modelling positive online behaviour at home.

As adults, the way we use technology sends a strong message to our kids. Here are a few simple ways to help build safe and respectful digital habits together:

Set healthy boundaries

Talk about screen time limits and stick to them as a family. Try to make time for device-free meals or activities to show that balance is important.

Use technology together

Sit with your child while they're online — ask questions, show interest, and encourage them to think critically about what they're seeing or doing.

Be open about mistakes

If you make a mistake online (like clicking a dodgy link or oversharing), talk about it. It shows kids that it's okay to ask for help and learn from errors.

Talk about respect

Model respectful behaviour when commenting, sharing, or messaging online. Kids learn a lot from how we treat others — both online and off.
