# Do you remember going on adventures as a child and walking to school?

Over the past 40 years, since you were young, children's walking and cycling to school has declined from 75% to 25%, today some experts suggest it may be as little as 15%!

In an effort to help more children to walk to school and embrace improved health and wellbeing, our Primary School is launching PARK IT ... and your family is invited to participate!

In term 2 2025, our School Community it is trialling a new drop-off/pick-up point at Forrest Street
Playground supported by a playful pathway to the school (encompassing walking routes to both the front and back entries) designed by our Grade 5/6 students –

To help introduce our school families to the new pathway, our teachers will be attending Forrest Street Playground on the following times:

- •Tuesday 20 May from 3.15pm onwards Departing from the school at 3.15pm (sharp)
- •Wednesday 21 May from 8.15am onwards Departing for school at 8.20am (sharp)
- Wednesday 28 May from 8.15am onwards -Departing for Breakfast club at 8.20am (sharp)
- •Wednesday 11 June from 8.15am onwards -Departing for school at 8.20am (sharp)

Please note that we will be departing for School (as a group) at **8.20am (sharp)** on our Three Wednesday mornings, if you would like your child/ren to participate, please ensure they arrive at Forrest Street playground prior to 8.20am.

#### What is Park IT?

Park IT is an active travel Initiative that provides car-dependent families with new drop-off/pick-up points within 1km from the school gate, alongside a new child-friendly pathway to get to school... designed by our students!



We kindly ask that everyone looks out for our children and broader community members when driving near our school, particularly when driving through the street crossing at Elizabeth Drive (see map) so we can look after everyone's safety and support a more active and healthy school community.
