Gold Coin Donation Casual Clothes Day –

5/6 students are bringing a burst of colour and energy to SHPS with a special Casual Clothes Day. This fun event has been designed and organised by our senior students as part of their Term 4 Inquiry Unit -Care for Kids. Through this unit, students have been exploring ways they can take action to help others, make a positive difference in our community. To celebrate the end of term and support a fantastic cause, we are inviting all students to come dressed in casual clothes with the theme "Fluro - Like a Highlighter." Students can go all out in bright, head-to-toe Fluro or simply add a splash of neon colour — every little bit of brightness will add to the fun and atmosphere of the day. We ask that all students bring a gold coin donation on the day. Money raised will be donated to Stationery Aid, a not-for-profit organisation that collects, sorts, cleans and repackages excess and used school stationery items. These items are then redistributed to students experiencing hardship across Australia, ensuring that every child has access to the basic tools they need for learning. Why Stationery Aid? This organisation aligns perfectly with our students' learning theme of Care for Kids. By supporting Stationery Aid, our students are helping to reduce waste, promote sustainability, and most importantly, support underprivileged children who may otherwise start school without essential supplies.


