- Fits comfortably and securely



Next Friday, 12th September, SHPS will proudly join the nationwide conversation for R U OK? Day, a special day dedicated to encouraging everyone to check in with those around them and ask a simple, powerful question: "Are you OK?"

At its heart, R U OK? Day is about connection. It reminds us that sometimes the smallest actions — like a warm conversation — can make the biggest difference in someone's life. Whether it's a classmate, teacher, parent, friend, or neighbour, taking the time to



ask how someone is going can open the door to comfort, care, and even life-changing support. Here are some simple ways to start the conversation:

Ask the question: A gentle, genuine "Are you OK?" can show someone that you care and that they're not alone. Listen with empathy: You don't have to fix their problems — sometimes just listening without judgement can be exactly what they need. Encourage action: If they're struggling, offer help by suggesting they talk to someone they trust or do something that might help them feel better. Check in again: A follow-up message or chat days later shows you care and reminds them that support is ongoing, not just a one-off.
