

Sunsmark

As part of both Sunbury Heights Primary School and the Department of Education's SunSmart Policy, all students are required to wear a broad-brimmed hat from September 1st through to April 30th (Terms 1 & 4). With the warmer weather returning, we remind all students and families to ensure hats are worn during break times and outdoor activities — UV rays can be strong even on cloudy days!

Sunscreen:

We recommend applying sunscreen before coming to school each day. Sunscreen is available in each classroom, but if your child has sensitive skin or needs a specific brand, please send one from home clearly labelled with their name.
