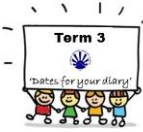

On Wednesday, Anne from Western Water came to visit our Year 1 students. As part of our Inquiry about 'Earth's Precious Resources', our students explored the different ways we use water at school and home. Students worked together with props such as a nozzle, plug, and bucket to investigate the little things we can do to save water. Using a plug for brushing teeth, a bucket for washing the car and a nozzle to water the garden were just some of the tricks the children discovered. Anne also talked with them about the use of bark to absorb and store water and how evaporation and low rainfall affect farmer's crops and the food we need to survive. The children really enjoyed this experience and will no doubt be reminding you how to save water and look after our planet!

### Soccer COPPS

Last Friday students in Years 3-6 participated in the Soccer COPPS program. Students enjoyed all the activities in the clinic, learning new skills from members of the Victorian Police Soccer Club. They had the opportunity to engage with Police Officers in a positive environment and learnt all about the role Police have in our community, while it was reinforced what to do in an emergency and how to contact them should the need arise.
