### Welcome back to all our families.

Our Year 5/6 students are settling in and have made a positive start to their learning in 2023, and as school leaders in the Upper School. The 5/6 Team also welcomes four new teachers to the team who bring new experiences and ideas.

## **Term 1 Classroom Learning**

Our Inquiry Learning this term is entitled "Making Democracy." Our students will deepen their understandings about the meaning of democracy and how this looks at a local, state and federal level and how laws are passed.

In Mathematics students will revise and extend their counting, place value, time and temperature knowledge, skills and understandings.

In English we will focus on drafting powerful narratives and persuasive texts that consider the audience and purpose whilst working through the writing process. They will also have opportunities to have greater choice in our Free Write sessions. As readers we will focus on selecting the right texts and building our reading stamina as we explore different text types.

In the second half of this term all our classes will learn about the changes, joys and challenges that puberty brings. Classroom teachers will facilitate this in their own classroom, with their usual class teacher. Students will learn more about the physical, social and emotional changes and also about the importance of hygiene, exercise and a healthy diet.
